AV Capture V2.10 Installation Quick Start Guide

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1. SOFTWARE COMPONENTS

The AVC installer includes 3 major components. Each component is an integral part of AVC functionality. These components are:

1. AV Capture (AVC): Main desktop application
2. AVCA Publish Manager: Provides system tray publish notifications
3. AVCA Add-in for Microsoft Word: Provides a menu of AVC tools in Microsoft Word

2. BEFORE YOU BEGIN

The purpose of this quick start guide is to provide basic installation and setup instructions. It is recommended for use if you are already familiar with the software, or if your organization's network and A/V system architecture are simple and straightforward. See our [Installation Manual](#) for comprehensive installation and setup information.

Before installing AVC, be sure that the PC meets our [minimum system requirements](#).

To run the AVC installer, a Windows user account with administrator credentials is required.

If the AVCA Main Storage folder will be located on the recording PC, the existing permissions are likely sufficient. However, if the Main Storage Folder is to be located on a network server, you must give the User(s) read/write/modify permissions at the share level.

Ensure that the audio and video recording devices are connected to the PC and powered on. An audio recording device must be enabled in order to complete the AVC setup wizard.

3. PROCEDURE

3.1 INSTALLATION

1. [Download](#) and run the AVC installer.
2. Complete the installation wizard, and click Finish to launch AVC.

3.2 LICENSE ACTIVATION

3. The license activation window will open automatically when first launching AVC. Select the desired product (e.g. Legislative) and use your AVCA credentials to activate the AVC license.
4. If activating more than one license (e.g. both Legislative and Judicial editions), make a note to do so via the Info button after the initial setup is complete.

3.3 SETUP

5. The AVC setup wizard will launch after successful license activation. Check the "Show Advanced Settings" checkbox and click Next. The remainder of this section focuses only on the critical settings for initial setup.
6. General:
 - a. External Clock Serial Port – if an external clock is in use, set the Com port used
 - b. Publish as Private by Default – check this box if your organization does not want published sessions to be available to the public
7. Storage:
 - a. Main Storage Folder – if using a network storage location, the UNC path must be entered (mapped drive letters will cause errors during operation)
 - b. Local Backup Folder – this location must remain on the local hard drive
 - c. Session Names & Session Locations – adding these now will save the end user from having to type in these details for each session
8. A/V Input:
 - a. Audio Device – select the audio device to be used for recording (required)
 - b. Video Device – select the camera to be used for recording (if applicable)
 - c. Video Size – set the desired video source resolution (if a Video Device is selected)
 - d. IP Camera – alternative audio/video input source (if applicable)
9. A/V Output:
 - a. Video Codec – select "H.264" for video, or "audio-only" if only recording audio
 - b. Enable Live Streaming – check this box only if your subscription includes live streaming
 - c. Use the default values for all other settings
